# Message from our President "Our Centre of Attraction"

Here's hoping for a Navroze full of peace around the world, nourishment to those less fortunate and good health to all.

Like a good friend, our centre is here to stay. Needless to say, our community is blessed with a strong support network of friends and family to assist each other during our times of need. Also, our newly established immigrant support service will ease the transition of recently arrived Zoroastrians to their new home in Canada.

Our OZCF Zoroastrian Religious and Cultural Centre now serves as a focal point for Iranian and Parsi youth, adult and seniors' activities to an extent we could have never imagined possible before buying the land. We celebrated Navroze, Khordad sal and the Muktad ceremonies here for the first time ever; we hold regular board and committee meetings; the weekends will see regular social and leisure activities; community members continue to use the centre for prayers and special occasions; and a cricket field is being built by our sports committee.

I am pleased to report that the board of directors has decided to pay down our land loan by \$100,000. We have now completed the topographic survey of the property and developed preliminary conceptual architectural plans created by a Zoroastrian architect voluntarily.

This will enable us to put forward our position to the town of Oakville early in the planning process for the area, to permit us to build our intended structures in the future. We will consult with the membership for their ideas prior to developing and finalizing design plans for the ultimate buildings. For the short-term, we are now in the process of examining the feasibility of upgrading the current facility to enable us to accommodate community gatherings until the new structures are built over the next few years.

We are blessed to have received useable artifacts from a closed agyiari in Africa that we will proudly use some day in our own place of worship. They were donated to us entirely and we thank the Talati family and Rusi Dalal for their tireless efforts in arranging to bring these beautiful historical articles here.

We pray that this New Year brings joy and peace to all of our lives. May Ahura Mazda always bless our community.


# As We Grow: 1187 Burnhamthorpe Road

### Kudos to Viraf Kapadia

Recently, **Viraf Kapadia** and Star Navigation Systems were mentioned in the Globe & Mail (March 21, 2006 issue). In an article discussing patents the first one mentioned was Star Navigation Systems Group Ltd., who was awarded its first patent in 2005 and signed about \$17 million in orders for its in-flight safety monitoring system (ISMS).

In 2006, the company secured a second patent from Hong Kong. Based on that, the company has forecast even more success in 2006. "When you have a product that flies through the airspace of a number of countries, you want patent protection in each of those countries." Initially, the main focus was on gaining patent protection in Britain, Hong Kong and North America.

The ISMS system is the first in the world to provide in-flight data monitoring and diagnostics with a real-time secure connection between the aircraft and the ground.

Viraf has been very generous with his good fortune. At our recent Gala in November, he very graciously donated 40,000 shares in the company to the OZCF. We wish Viraf Kapadia all the best in his future endeavours.

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
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#### **Fundraiser Initiatives**

In December, 2005, Behram Baxter (formerly of Toronto) went to Navsari for the opening ceremonies of the Dolat and Hormusji Vandrewala Senior Citizens Centre named after his parents., . Why is that so interesting? The answer: had it not been for Behram's financial backing the centre would not have been built.

It all came about when Behram, now a resident of California, was looking for a place in the Maneckbai P.B. Jeejeebhoy Senior Centre for his aging mother. When he was told that there were no places and that there was a waiting list he asked why a new one was not being built. The answer he got- "If you finance it, we'll do it". The centre is run by the World Zoroastrian Organization and has been in operation since 1998.

As Behram jokingly tells a Parsiana reporter, "Once I shot my mouth off I couldn't back out". The project took 18 months to complete once the land was purchased. It cost 60 lakhs to complete the project with another 15 lakhs being put towards a maintenance fund.

In 1967 Behram moved to Toronto from Bombay and promptly changed his name from Vandrewala to Baxter (the name of his first boss in Bombay). He made his fortune in Toronto's real estate market and then moved to a warmer climate where he now lives with his wife, Rena.

Life has not always been easy for Behram and he has earned his millions through hard work, timing and sometimes sheer guts. He has always put his money where his mouth is and never minced his words. Always a strong supporter of the OZCF Behram was one of the first people to donate to the OZCF and continues to support our initiatives.
