Message from our President Let's Begin Building

Over the past several months, your board of directors has been busily working on the 2006 budget and developing short and long term plans for our new facilities at 1187 Burnhamthorpe Rd. E. We will be calling a membership meeting soon to discuss details of the plans and for your feedback. I am pleased to inform the membership that after reviewing various thoughtful names submitted by the membership, Zoroastrian Religious and Cultural Centre was selected for our facilities and recommended by the board of directors. As the new home of the OZCF, the name incorporates the religious dimension of our tradition and the cultural theme of a community organization. We have just completed our 2006 budget and are pleased to deliver a surplus after making scheduled loan payments. At our meeting we will discuss whether we wish to pay down some of our loan or keep it for future building costs.

The next phase of our project is to create useable facilities for the membership and will involve a two stage approach:

- 1. In the first stage we will perform minor upgrades and immediate repairs to the two existing buildings to make them functional for a two to three year period, until new facilities are built. This will enable us to accommodate about 125 people in the house and 150 in the garage. For larger functions during the summer, a marquis arrangement will be made. We want to be careful not to invest too much in these older facilities since they will not be used to a great extent in the future. However a small capital and yearly investment will be required to meet immediate community needs until a new structure is built.
- 2. The second stage, concurrent with the first, will involve planning and designing the facilities and starting the construction. We have taken a close look at our vision and have interviewed architects and planners on incorporating our ideas into actual drawings, including sizes and capacities of buildings. These preliminary conceptual illustrations will be presented to the membership for feedback. Our overall vision remains consistent and includes facilities for a place of worship, banquet hall, community and recreation centre, senior's home, as well as cultural and educational activities. These buildings and uses range in timeframe from the immediate (present-5 years) to long term (5-10 years).

We are also creating a strategic development plan that will be used by the town's planning department to understand our needs and shape the new official plan of the town to meet our future requirements. We are now entering a critical phase in the evolution of our organization as we shape the future of our community here in Ontario, Canada and worldwide. I encourage everyone to participate in constructive discussion throughout this process and donate generously to our cause. To-date, the response has been terrific with heavy usage of the facilities for jashans, meetings, and many activities. Skating rinks along with soccer and cricket fields are being planned. We appreciate the services of our many volunteers and professionals for fixing-up the place and offering advice. We thank our surrounding communities for their generosity, such as the Toronto Police Force which gave us nine computer systems for use by children and new immigrants. On and on, the momentum builds, as we celebrate each day in our new home with family and friends. So let's roll up our sleeves and start working, hand in hand, brick by brick, building for the future – for tomorrow is near.

May Ahura Mazda always bless our community and bring peace and hope to all in 2006.


Hug of a Lifetime




The following is an excerpt of an article taken from Times News Network Mumbai: Almost two years after vandals destroyed rare stained-glass panels covering the canopy of the ancient Bhika Behram, the grieving girl was run over by a speeding car in south Mumbai. Although the police launched a manhunt, the unidentified motorist was never caught. Her family then decided to restore the stained-glass panels in her memory. The



The Bhika Behram well is perhaps the oldest sweet water well in Mumbai, sunken way back in the year 1725. It is one of the few Parsi wells in the city which has one entrance for the community members and another one for non-Parsis to draw water. The well has an interesting history relating to a Parsi named Bhikhaji

Behramji, who came to Mumbai on foot from Broach (Bharuch in Gujarat) to seek his fortune some time around the year 1715. The story goes that a penniless Bhikhaji was captured by the Marathas who mistook him for a Muslim. At that time, the Marathas were at war with the Sultans of Gujarat.



in recent history, over 2,000 Zoroastrians held a candlelight vigil at Azad Maidan in protest soon after. In this case too, the police failed to trace

He was imprisoned in a fortress called Pandegad but was later released when he convinced his captors that he was a Parsi by showing them his religious garments of sudreh and kusti. However, according to some, it was not Bhikhaji but his grandfather Khurshedji who came from Broach to Mumbai in 1665. They say it was the grandfather and not the grandson who was arrested by the Marathas. In the course of time Bhikhaji became a successful merchant having his business at "Angrez Bazaar" now known as Horniman Circle. As a token of his gratitude, he sank the well named after him in 1725. Sunlight shines, once again, through the newly-installed stained glass panels at the Bhika Behram well. in Churchgate on Wednesday. Not necessary to put this bit in as the Wednesday came and went last month.



Fezana Performing & Creative Arts Scholarship FundObjectives

The FEZANA Performing and Creative Arts Scholarship (P&CAS) provides financial support to Zarathustis who are performing artists in music, drama, etc. or practice other creative art forms like literature, poetry, fine arts, sculpture, painting, etc. The purpose of the scholarship is to enable the recipients to study with experts in their field and thus fine tune and enhance their talent and capabilities, BUT NOT FOR BASIC EDUCATION IN THE ABOVE FIELDS.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must (1) profess and practice the Zarathushti faith (2) be high school graduates (3) be legal residents or citizens of USA or Canada. Foreign students holding legal status in USA or Canada may also apply provided they have been in North America for at least one year. Awards will be determined on an annual basis by the judges chosen by the P&CAS Committee. Applicants will be eligible to receive a maximum of two awards, which may or may not be in consecutive years.

Selection Criteria

Applicants will be judged on their academic preparation, and past record in their program of study, their commitment to pursue the chosen art form, their annual financial need, the assistance pledged by other sources, extra curricular activities and services performed for the Zarathushti community.

Application Procedure

Application forms will be available on the FEZANA website or from the members of the P&CAS committee. However, applications cannot be submitted electronically as examples and proof of the applicants work (portfolio) will be required.
