President's Message

Oh Canada!

July 1st is special in that it is always a confluence of events marking Canada Day and the Maidhyoishem Ghambar which designates the arrival of summer. It is also the day of Fasli Tirgan, when Tir Mah (month) and Tir Roj (day) fall on the same day, which is considered to be auspicious.

We fêted our nation's sesquicentennial anniversary and concurrently, celebrants, partook in Tirgan which was hosted collectively for the first time by OZCF, ZSO and Kanoun at the ZRCC. A huge shout out to the Entertainment Committees of all three organizations who had collaborated at length over the past few months to stage the event.



The day started off with six priests performing the Maidhyoishem Ghambar prayers. Four of the priests were young (under 30) and function after function, we continue having younger priests performing prayers. It's a real asset to our community to have them within our ranks and bodes extremely well for our future.

According to Iranian folklore, Tirgan is the celebration of the arrival of rain during the hot summer months to enhance harvest and counter drought. Today, celebrants frolic and toss water at each other. While attendees certainly took part in this ritual, there were also sack races and face painting for younger members as well as tug-of-war and basketball games for youth and adults.

I would like to acknowledge Zarine, Cawas, Ronnie and Delbar Irani and their family cooking for all us. The family always provide the meal at the Maidhyoishem Ghambar but took it to another level in cooking for all 240 of us in attendance, a huge undertaking on their part.

In the afternoon we had everyone gather for the singing of Oh Canada! as we paid tribute to our country's 150th birthday, at which point the rains came down for a short while, and right on cue, providing the perfect backdrop to the Tirgan festival.

Since the arrival of summer, we've been on a fast and furious pace of an event per week.

On June 24th, the Scouts Group held their Annual Fundraiser at the ZRCC. With the proceeds, they have been able to send 14 scouts and 4 leaders to this year's jamboree in Nova Scotia.

The following day, the OZCF held its 15th Annual General Meeting with a strong turnout.

On July 9th, the 9th Annual Cricket Dhansak took place on our grounds and we held the summer picnic at the ZRCC on Sunday, July 16th.

PLACE OF WORSHIP ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Place of Worship Advisory Committee (PWAC) is busily coordinating activities which are being undertaken by various consultants and planners for the rezoning process. The process typically requires studies conducted by various specialist consultants, including: Functional Servicing Study; Stormwater Management Study; Environmental Implementation Report; Private Septic, Well and Fire Pond Evaluation; Environmental Site Assessment; Transportation Impact Analysis; Archaeological Assessment; Bird Breeding Study; Planning Justification Report; Urban Design Brief; and any additional studies deemed necessary during the review process.

The studies are anticipated to be completed by the end of September of 2017, and will be submitted to the Town of Oakville, Regional Municipality of Halton, and Conservation Authority for review. The review period usually takes up to one year. Concurrently with the rezoning review, we will file applications for Site Plan Approval and all of the detailed architectural design and building elevations will be completed during this time.

We have received information on government fees and consultant costs, typical of such rezoning processes, which have been verified by our planners. These amounts had already been considered in our overall construction budget but do not include additional costs should more studies or fees be required. Some of these studies are already underway.

This is a busy and exciting time for our community as we bring alive the building of a consecrated Atashkadeh in North America. This has been an enlightening learning experience for all of us. Our Mobed team is in constant contact with authorities in India to discuss the required procedures to start up, construct, and develop the place of worship, and we are busily working with the architect to refine and finalize detailed design.

Thank you again to all of our generous donors who have brought us this far. If you have not already done so and are now considering it, please do join us on this incredible journey that will ensure the survival of Zoroastrianism for future generations, by making a tax-free donation toward this worthy cause. If you should have any comments or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Asha Vahishta Sessions 6 and 7 – Recap

The sixth session of the Asha Vahishta Seminar series, held on May 6th, dealt with the theme of blasphemy, heresy, heterodoxy and its context to and within Zoroastrianism. Participants began by defining and understanding these concepts in relation to religion.

How and why these concepts hold meaning was discussed, in relation to when and for what purpose they are used during a religious discussion.

Held on June 10th, the seventh session of the Asha Vahishta Seminar Series was conducted as a 'Conversation in Faith'.

Dr. Neville G. Panthaki and Ervad Gustad M. Panthaki engaged in a conversation in faith (about faith and fellowship), while engaging in-faith with one another. With regard to the latter point (in-faith), it is meant that the discussion was conducted honestly and openly.

As such the session displayed an intimacy of familiarity between the discussants (between son and father), often taking a heightened tone. This was intentional, in that it was not avoided due to any perception and pretenses towards 'polite conversation' which is often restrained in the vigour and passion of its dialogue. Indeed, the opportunity for the audience to witness the attachment to faith was displayed, along with the divergent opinions of the discussants.

As an extended session of four hours, perspectives were shared, but more importantly the rationale behind opinions was investigated. It became clear that any disagreements and impassioned statements were the result from a sincere desire not only to be understood, but also to repair fractures. This became one of the most important insights into the session.

The discussants conversations revolved around topics and questions, which were compiled from the audience. It became clear that answers were predicated upon the sociocultural and locational experiences of the respondent. More importantly, that understanding about the definition of faith and fellowship, was the basis from which answers arose.

Hence, one of the conclusions to this session and at the end of this phase of the seminar series in general, is that further talk and discussion regarding contemporary issues of Zoroastrianism requires a grounding of clarity (regarding faith and fellowship).

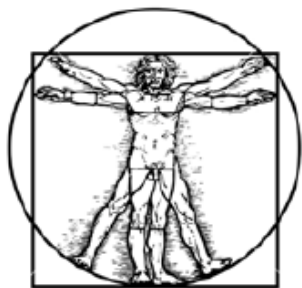
SHERIDAN CENTRE FOR ELDER RESEARCH

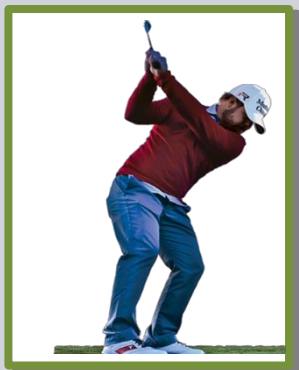
