PLACE OF WORSHIP ADVISORY COMMITTEE UPDATE

We are pleased to report that our revised Site Plan Approval (SPA) application has been submitted to the Town and other agencies for review and approval. This approval period will take approximately six weeks. In the meanwhile we are finalizing the interior and exterior designs with the consultants as well as specification documents for tendering, which we propose to send to contractors during the SPA period. Concurrently we will work on the Building Permit application and propose to submit this together with the final drawings while SPA is being reviewed. We will review contractor proposals and decide on a final contractor through negotiations.

As standard procedure, SPA will be conditional on us providing the town certain deposits, development and permit fees and refundable performance security to ensure we complete the construction according to specifications.

Upon receiving Site Plan Approval and tender prices, and before we submit any deposits or fees, or make any commitments with the contractor, we will meet with the community to discuss moving forward steps prior to construction. As the community is no doubt aware, over the past 18 months, construction prices have increased significantly due to Covid, resulting in a short supply of materials and labour. As previously mentioned, we undertook an intensive value engineering exercise over the past year to reduce costs significantly. We anticipate costs to come in lower than the original bids at the start of Covid, through our design adjustments. However, based on our extensive market intelligence and meetings with various contractors and architect, we know that our pricing will still come in higher than what we budgeted.

We will develop a strategy to present to the membership on procuring the necessary finances and looking to the membership to generously contribute to cover the shortfall. The final decision will rest with the membership on how it wishes to proceed. We will keep the board and membership apprised of progress over what will be a busy upcoming 8 - 10 weeks.

A poignant reminder to our readership that these are proactive, diligent, studying and/or working fulltime, young men who voluntarily give up their time to service our growing community.

Check out these dynamic individuals:

Nekzad Illava was ordained a Navar in 2014 at the Bai Motlibai Wadia Agiary in Jogeshwari, Mumbai. He is the only young Mobed in Canada to have been ordained a Maratab in 2017. Nekzad is one of the Mobeds from OZCF of the three young Mobeds from North America learning the Avesta language under Dr. Ramiyar Karanjia with a scholarship from The North American Mobeds Council (NAMC). Nekzad starts his university journey this September, at Queens, majoring in Psychology.

Rohaan Kotwal was ordained a Navar in 2000 at the Vatcha Gandhi Agiary in Gamdevi, Mumbai. He completed his Hospitality & Travel program and Business Management from Niagara College in 2019. Currently, Rohaan is working with The Travel Corporation and resides in the Niagara region.

Armaan Panthaki was ordained a Navar in 2008 at the Rustom Framna Agiary in Dadar, Mumbai. He graduated from McMaster University in April 2021 in Mechatronics Engineering. He is currently working at Dofasco Steel.

BINGO


